

#### **Dear Parents/Guardians**

This booklet is to provide you with financial information about the contributions and charges that will apply at Waroona District High School in 2019.

For students from Kindergarten to Year 6 the total amount of Voluntary Contributions parents and carers are being asked to pay has been contained to \$60.00.

For secondary students the total amount of Voluntary Contributions parents and carers are being asked to pay has been contained to \$235.00 per student. The secondary costing is the same amount which can be claimed through the Secondary Assistance Scheme for those parents/guardians who are eligible.

If your child chooses to do an additional specialised extra cost program in Years 7 - 10, these charges are compulsory and must be paid.

#### 2019 SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME - PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans' Affairs card which lists the student as a dependant.

The allowance consists of two components:

\$235 Educational Program Allowance which is paid directly to the school. Any compulsory charges will be an additional cost to the parent/guardian, as this is not covered by the Secondary Assistance Scheme.

\$115 Clothing Allowance is paid directly to the parent/guardian for other expenses such as uniforms or stationery supplies. Please bring in Bank Account details e.g. BSB and Bank Account Number.

You can also elect to pay this allowance to the school if you prefer, to be used to pay for any additional charges.

Parents/guardians in receipt of the ABSTUDY School Allowance from the Department of Human Resources (Centrelink) are not eligible for the Secondary Assistance Scheme. However, they can apply for the ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance. Forms are available for completion in the Administration Office. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans' Affairs card which lists the student as a dependant and present this when completing the form.

Applications for these allowances for students enrolled in Years 7 - 10, must be completed by the parent or guardian in <u>Term 1 prior to the closing date of Friday 12 April 2019</u>. Applications cannot be processed after this date.

# SECONDARY ASSISTANCE CAN BE CLAIMED AND CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES PAID AT THE ADMINISTRATION OFFICE BETWEEN 8.00AM AND 4.00PM DAILY FROM TUESDAY, 29 JANUARY 2019.

#### **SECONDARY CHARGES**

We stress that the following charges are set at the maximum amount. These charges are payable when the activity takes place.

Year 7 to 10 Country Week  The actual cost may be less depending on subsidy by fundraising	\$500.00 per year, per student
Country Week Shirts/Jackets	\$60.00, per student
<b>Year 7 to 10 Physical Education Activity</b> There is usually 1 activity per year group	\$40.00 per year, per student
Excursions Year 10 Careers Activities – 2 trips per year	\$55.00 per year, per student
Cultural Activities  There are usually 4-5 Cultural Activities each year.  Examples of Cultural Activities are events such as visiting Theatre Groups,  Chaplain related activities, Musical Performances, Artists etc.	\$40.00 per year, per student
