



## FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Welcome to the final Term 2 edition of our school newsletter. I am absolutely delighted to be able to publicly announce Waroona District High School's success in gaining Independent Public School status commencing Semester 2, 2020. As an Independent Public School we are still part of the public education system and must deliver the Australian Curriculum, but as a staff and school community, we will now have greater autonomy and flexibility to meet the needs of our students. This change in status is recognition of our increased capacity to manage our own affairs which has been achieved through our commitment to an explicit school improvement agenda and relentless focus on improved outcomes for our students. I sincerely thank our Council Chair, Mr Brad Vitale, who participated in the application and selection process with me. I also thank the School Council members, the P&C members and wider parent and community body for your support in this process. Waroona District High School is on a journey of change and improvement and having our school community on board and supporting us in this journey is critical to our success.

Term 2 has been a busy one and by the time you read this, the electronic distribution of Semester 1 reports via Connect will have occurred. At this stage I can confirm that the on-site parent/teacher interviews planned for Tuesday 27 July will proceed. We are working hard to ensure parent/carer and teacher communication is prioritised and that any parent/carer who wishes to meet with a teacher to discuss student progress is able to do so. Parent interviews this year will be centrally located in the school library with both primary and secondary staff co-located in the one area. This has been planned to make it easier for parents to see all the teachers that they may wish to meet with, in the one location. Interviews are capped at 15 minute timeslots, to enable teachers to see as many parents as possible. It is encouraged that you bring your child along as part of this feedback process. Details on the booking process for parent/teacher interviews will be provided with the Semester 1 reports.

I am pleased to report that our OLNA results for Semester 1, 2020 showed significant improvement on previous years with 33% of students having met the OLNA requirements after the first round of testing. This means that a third of our Year 10 students have passed all three tests; Reading, Writing and Numeracy. To put this into perspective, only 19% of students in "Like Schools" (schools like Waroona) have met the OLNA requirements. Students have an additional opportunity to pass OLNA in Semester 2 this year and a further two opportunities in Year 11 and Year 12. We are certainly achieving our Strategic Plan target of exceeding Like Schools in our OLNA achievement. This success is due to a range of support programs embedded in Maths and English classes via our secondary teachers. I look forward to seeing the results of our second round of testing in Semester 2.

The recent production and distribution of Version 2 of the Waroona District High School Strategic Plan is the culmination of 6 months of revisioning our school as the "School of Choice" in the local community. Initial feedback from parents and community members attending the Term 2 School Council meeting, where the final Strategic Plan was tabled and accepted, was that the professional production of the Strategic Plan and Annual Report are outstanding. These views were supported at a subsequent P&C meeting. Parent and community feedback across the school this year has been overwhelmingly supportive and there is a great sense of pride within the community that our school is doing so well. This is always great for a principal to hear. Further, I was recently approached by the Principal Consultant for Behaviour and Engagement from the South Metropolitan Education Region, to use our recently produced Positive Student Behaviour Support Policy as an exemplar across the region. I am very proud to have our hard work on show, but the real success of this policy is in the consistent implementation across the school. To this end, staff have been engaged in a three-day training program on Classroom Management Strategies (CMS) as part of our commitment to providing an orderly learning environment.

As a result of our hard work in improving academic and social outcomes for our students, Waroona District High School is enjoying increased enrolments this year as the community gains confidence in our ability to deliver high quality teaching and learning. However, as an organisation we will never rest on our laurels. To achieve the best outcomes for our students, your children, we must continue to work hard at sustaining a culture of self-reflection and continual improvement. To accomplish this there is clearly a need to analyse and respond to data and the achievement of the targets contained in the Strategic Plan 2019-2021. We conduct this analysis on an ongoing basis. Our current efforts are focussed on the implementation of a teaching and learning framework and whole school instructional model.

I'd like to thank two retiring staff members, Lucy Cavallaro and Joan O'Brien, for their contributions to our school over many years. I wish them well in their retirements and know they will be missed by all.

I sincerely wish you all a safe and relaxing holiday. I hope that you make the most of the eased COVID-19 restrictions that we are so lucky to be able to enjoy in this wonderful state of ours. I look forward to Term 3 and the commencement of Semester 2, 2020. I hope to see 100% of students back at school and unless sick, attending 100% of the time. Parents, we urge you to support our efforts to increase student attendance. Regular attendance is vital for continuity of learning and improved academic and social outcomes.

## SECONDARY NEWS

**Secondary Reporting** – with the disruption caused by COVID reports may read a little differently this semester for most students. Staff that have been able to make a judgement about grades, based on the data available, have done so. These are mid-year grades so students have plenty of time to work on improving their grades even further for 2020.

Our Year 10 students will also receive a second report this Term; this report will focus on the "Senior School" subjects they are completing and the progress made so far. These will include their Certificate II in Skills for Work and Vocational Pathways, Bushranger Endorsed Program, Skills for Life Pre-Driver Education Program and their current OLNA status.

All of the reports have been sent to Parents/Carers via Connect.

**OLNA** - The Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) was conducted earlier in the year, however for a few students this was interrupted due to COVID-19. These students have just completed their "catch-up" sessions and will receive their results early next term. Whilst we are well ahead of like schools for students that have passed all 3 aspects of OLNA, our Year 10 students have another opportunity in September.



The Year 9 students will sit OLNA in August (Week 4) as a replacement for the lost NAPLAN opportunity to pre-qualify for ONLA (Achieve a band 8 or above). It would be great to see a larger percentage of our students pre-qualify and get the added bonus of not having to sit any OLNA testing into the future.

**Toilets** - At the beginning of next term our secondary students will gain access to their upgraded toilet blocks. I have monitored the progress during the term and they look amazing. The blocks have been completely re tiled, with new partitions, toilets, showers, basins and windows. They are basically brand new throughout.

I would like to thank the secondary team of teachers that have stepped up this term to ensure the best educational programs possible, have been delivered to our students. Whether it be via work packages, online or face to face, they have worked tirelessly and I thank them for their efforts. I also wish all our school community a safe and COVID free holiday break and will see you refreshed next term.
