This list serves as a reminder of all the wonderful opportunities that we provide to our students at Waroona District High School. Of particular note was the whole school Athletics Carnival. What a fantastic carnival it was. The carnival was one where everyone participated, everyone had fun and this was really captured in the photographs of the day. For some it was a chance to shine and show their sporting prowess, for many it was an opportunity to try their hardest and have some fun. Many students chipped in to support staff with the running of the event.

RUOK Day was another notable event with everyone wearing yellow. There were yellow cupcakes and a BMX stunt show as well as mini lessons. Throughout the day there were really important messages about how to be a good friend, how to check in on others and ask them if they are ok, starting conversations and seeking support. We are very fortunate to have a student services team here with a coordinator, Miss Handley, an engagement officer, Miss Bonner, an Aboriginal Education officer Miss Farmer, Rodney the Chaplain and Mrs Conte our school psychologist. We also have youth workers Mark, Ashleigh and Roger. We care very much about student wellbeing as much as learning and, as a school, invest a lot of money in this area to provide support to those who need it.

Speaking of investing money, we are investing a lot of money in the refurbishment of the school library into a modern STEM/ICT/Resource hub. Structural works such as the entire pebblecrete ceilings being replaced, new lighting throughout, new paintwork throughout, new windows and the removal of old air conditioning and heating units – is all being funded by the Department of Education. The finishing touches such as new carpets, new shelving and some new furniture is being funded by the school from our library and furniture reserves. I am also delighted to say that through a very generous sponsorship arrangement with ALCOA, we will also be fitting out the new STEM and ICT labs with new furniture. The furnishing won't just be new, they will be moveable so that we can create different learning spaces. So think fluid, moveable, adaptable spaces – for our new STEM/ICT/Resource hub. Personally I am really excited about this new space and can't wait to see it completed early next term.

Due to COVID impacting excursions and camps in Term 1 and 2, instead of cancelling what was planned we rescheduled the majority of events to Term 4. We did this so that students didn't miss out. However, what this means is that it will be a disrupted term, so when you are here I do expect that it is heads down and productive time. I am delighted to say that in all respects our results this year are vastly improved on previous years: our academic data is up, our attendance data is up, our behaviour data is down. These are the improvements that our staff, our school board and our community have told us they want. And we are delivering. But we have a long way to go yet and each of you has a part to play in us achieving our vision of being the school of choice in the local community.

In Term 1 and Term 4, students must wear a hat when playing in a non-shaded area



Thanks to the generosity of the P&C, students in K-6 will be provided with a school issued hat for use at recess and lunch breaks as well as during sport/physical education lessons, camps and excursions. Students in Years 7-10 are to provide their own hats for use at recess and lunch breaks as well as during sport/physical education lessons, camps and excursions. The school will also provide spare hats and SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen to those students participating in sport/physical education. Students will be asked to wear a hat, however, the minimum requirement for participation in sport/physical education is the use of SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen.
