



FROM THE PRINCIPAL

It has been my pleasure to be part of the Waroona community. During my short period of time here, I have met some fantastic staff, student and families. I will be keeping in



touch with Ms Abbiss about how the students are progressing this year. In my final week here, things have changed with the lockdown. Some of our activities and events have had to be delayed until Term 3. Our guest speakers and NAIDOC assembly has been shifted to Term 3, however we have still been able celebrate at a school level with a range of cultural activities and celebrations.

During Week 9, we had Constable Care visit the school and we were very fortunate to have our Year 7-10 students School Dance. It was great to see the students dressed up and enjoying the evening. A special thank you to Miss Bonner and the Student Council for setting up the event and Mr Edwards for his DJ skills and to the staff for their time and support.

When I arrived here, we were at the start of winter or Makuru, the cold wet time of the year. My first day here, was the coldest day for a very long time. When you return from school holidays on Tuesday 20th July, we will be coming to the end of the Makuru season and moving into the Djilba season – a mixture of wet days with an increasing number of clear cold nights and pleasant, warmer days. I

can't wait for more of the warmer days so that I can thaw out.

The electronic distribution of Semester One reports via Connect will be commencing this week. At this stage I can confirm that the on-site parent/carer/teacher interviews planned for Monday 26th July from 2.45pm to 5.15pm will go ahead. We are working hard to ensure parent/carer and teacher communication is prioritised and that any parent/carer who wishes to meet with a teacher to discuss student progress is able to do so. Parent interviews will be centrally located in the school library with both primary and secondary staff co-located in the one area. This has been planned to make it easier for parents to see all the teachers that they may wish to meet with, in the one location. Interviews are capped at 15 minute timeslots, to enable teachers to see as many parents as possible. It is encouraged that you bring your child along as part of this feedback process. Details on the booking process for parent/teacher interviews will be provided with the Semester One reports.

Attendance is a significant focus for Waroona DHS. Earlier this week, we had a prize draw for students with regular attendance (greater than 90%). Our current attendance rate is **87.2**%. It is slightly below regular, but something we can work on in Semester 2.

Year 4 Gifted and Talented Testing (PEAC) - The Primary Enrichment and Challenge (PEAC) Program provides part time extension and enrichment for exceptionally able students in Years 5 and 6.

PEAC offers a range of courses that provide identified students with work that is intellectually challenging. All students in Year 4 will have the opportunity to be assessed for suitability for the PEAC Program. Testing at Waroona District High School will occur on *Thursday 5th August 2021*. The scores from the test will be used in the selection of students for PEAC courses and extension programs during 2022 to 2023 and also to inform educational provision in schools.


