



#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I am really pleased with the start to the 2023 school year. I have received comments from many staff and parents about the calm, happy, and productive feel in the school. This is the first start to a school year in three years in which we have not had to contend with some type of COVID-19 restriction or disruption. We certainly seem to be back to 'business as usual' as we continue to build on our successes over the last few years despite the challenges of COVID-19.

I'm currently writing the Annual Report for the 2022 school year. The focus of this is on the amazing successes we had over 2022. For example, 95% of our Year 10 students achieved a Certificate II in Skills for Work giving them a massive head-start towards their WACE Certificate in Year 11 & 12. Further, our Year 10 OLNA achievement was more than twice that of Like Schools. Our attendance rates for 2022 were outstanding being above both Like Schools and the average of all WA Public Schools in every category of attendance that the Department of Education measures. We laid some great foundations for success in 2022 to further build upon in 2023.

Whilst we had outstanding attendance data for last year compared to other Public Schools in WA it was still a little lower than our long-term average. I would therefore like to remind parents that in order for students to have good standing, their attendance rate should be at least 90%. Attendance will still be a focus for us to ensure our improvement is sustained and continues.

Throughout 2023 we will continue to embed our PBS CARES (Considerate, Aspiring, Responsible, Engaged and Safe) values in our everyday school routines. Students can be rewarded by being given jigsaw pieces matched to our CARES values by staff when a student demonstrates those values. Each jigsaw piece given enables the student to be entered into a CARES prize draw that will be drawn at each assembly.

Finally, I'd like to acknowledge how well our students have settled into the academic year. You set the standard for our school and for others to follow. I wish you all a successful and wonderful year ahead.

gone straight into working hard, asking questions, and demonstrating the school's "CARES" expectations.

Last year I was asking Parents and Carers to work with their children to familiarise themselves with the online 'Connect' system (due to COVID issues). I again encourage you to engage with your child and the connect system as many teachers have placed substantial amounts of their curriculum material online (Connect system). I encourage parents to spend an hour with their child getting to know the system and what it offers. Those High School students (39%) that have their own devices will have a seamless transition to and from school.

The Year 7 students attended a 'Team Skills' Bushrangers camp in the second week of the term. It was a fantastic opportunity for all students to get to know each other. I had a wonderful afternoon working with a team on an inflatable raft. We played a variety of games on the rafts, however a lot of the time we ended out of the raft, which was great fun.

The High School students will have the opportunity to attend a reward afternoon the last Thursday of Term One. All that will be required is a 90% attendance rate and no withdrawals / suspensions during Weeks 6-9. We expect the vast majority to achieve that target and enjoyed an afternoon outside the school.

As the Year 7 and 9 students will be completing their NAPLAN this term, it is important they do their very best as it may mean that they will prequalify for the OLNA (Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment) and thus not have to sit the tests in Years 10, 11 or 12. A great reason for them to do their absolute best.
