We find ourselves now at the end of Term 3, which has been a very busy term in our

school. With the summer now approaching I want to inform you of the following information in preparation for the upcoming bushfire season:

Important Information for the 2023/2024 Bushfire Season

Waroona District High School has been placed on the Department of Education bushfire zone register as it is located in a designated bushfire risk area.

If a fire behaviour index of 75 (extreme fire danger) or greater is forecast for the Shire of Waroona, a school may be required to invoke a pre-emptive (planned) closure. A 'catastrophic' fire danger rating poses a significant threat to the school if a fire starts. It is likely to be uncontrollable, unpredictable and fast-moving.

Parents and carers will receive a text message to inform them of a possible pre-emptive closure of the school.

The final decision to pre-emptively close the school will be confirmed with the principal no later than 4:30pm on the day before the pre-emptive closure. If the forecast changes after the 4:30pm deadline, the school remains closed.

Parents and carers will receive a text message to either confirm or cancel a pre-emptive closure of the school.

Typically, schools will be required to close for a day at a time however, this will depend on changing weather conditions. Parents and carers will receive a text message to advise if the school will reopen the day after the preemptive closure, or whether it will remain closed.

It has been a big term for teaching and learning with students and teachers getting on with important lessons across a variety of subjects. Teachers have not only been busy with the delivery of lessons, they have also engaged in Peer Review. This system involves teachers watching colleagues and feeding back information around our schools Teaching and Learning Framework. It is vitally important work, that our teaching staff have found incredibly valuable when reflecting on their own practise.

From the point of view of our students, coming to school every day counts. Studies have shown that students who miss large amounts of school are not able to catch up to the work that their peers are doing. It is important that students are present at school every day. To encourage this the school will be having a BBQ lunch on Thursday of Week 1 Term 4 (12 October) for students who have achieved regular attendance status, which is 90% or above. With NAPLAN results now available, the school, as a whole, can look at areas that we did particularly well in and areas that we need to refine practise. This work will occur over the next few weeks and is essential to make sure we are targeting areas for improvement.

As part of looking for these areas of improvement we work collaboratively with other schools in our District, Waroona District High School will be working as a collective with these other schools to examine writing achievement for our school. As part of this we will be moderating our work and comparing grades given for pieces of writing. This process is essential as it allows the school to accurately implement the state-wide judging standards and examine where further teaching needs to occur.

HEALTH – LET'S TALK ABOUT ... SCOLIOSIS

Scoliosis is an abnormal sideways curvature of the spine. It can be detected by a simple examination of the back.

The normal spine has three curves – one in the neck, on in the upper back and one in the lower back. These curves can be seen from the side, but when you look from behind the spine should appear straight. If the spine has a sideways curve, this is scoliosis.
