NAPLAN testing is undertaken by all students in these year groups across Australia and provides a snapshot of information about student progress across the country. The data that is provided by



NAPLAN will also help align the school's strategic direction and identify areas of strength and weakness that the school can reflect on.

Outside of this, teachers have been working incredibly hard getting to know their new students and beginning the process of teaching the new years curriculum. Having visited all the classes across the school, I can confidently say that our staff have thrown themselves into this 100%. Our wonderful Education Assistants are complimenting this work by providing targeted support to those students who require it and assisting students with Additional Needs.

Week Five is upon us. Our High School students have returned from their summer holidays and have got straight into working hard, asking questions and demonstrating the school's "CARES" expectations. It is a short term, so it is wonderful to see so many students taking their High School studies seriously.



The Year 7 students attended a Team Skills' Bushrangers camp in the second week of the term. It was a fantastic opportunity for all students to get to know each other. I had a wonderful afternoon collaborating with a team on paddle boards. We played a variety of games on the paddle boards with some of the time off the boards and in the water, which was great fun on the warm day.

Each year we ask Parents and Carers to work with their children to familiarise themselves with the online "Connect" system. I again encourage you to engage with your child and the connect system as teachers have placed substantial amounts of their curriculum material online (Connect system). COVID is still active in the community and already students that have been away sick have been able to keep up with their studies. Those High School students that have their own devices will have a seamless transition to and from school.

High School students will have the opportunity to attend a reward later in the term as part of the Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) rewards program. All that a student needs to do is have a 90% or above attendance rate and no withdrawals/suspensions during the term. We expect the vast majority to achieve that target and enjoy an afternoon outside the school classroom.

As the Year 7's and 9's will be completing their NAPLAN this term it is important they do their very best as it may mean that they will prequalify for the OLNA (Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment) and thus not have to sit the tests in Years 10, 11 or 12. A great reason for them to do their absolute best.

We encourage students to wear **orange** on Thursday 21 March 2024 to show their support.







SCHOOL STUDENT BROADBAND INITIATIVE

The Australian Government School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) is offering free home internet for eligible families with school-aged students until 31 December 2025.

To be eligible, families must:

- have no active broadband service
- have a device capable of accessing the internet
- live in premises where they can access a standard NBN service
- have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school.

The free broadband starts from the day the service is activated with a participating internet provider. Families will not be placed on a paid service by the internet provider at the end of the free service without consent.
